The Kentucky Department of Education has released the 2022-2023 Kentucky Summative Assessment (KSA) scores reflecting the new status and change system. Under the new accountability system, students in grades three through twelve are assessed in reading, math, science, social studies, and writing. These grade level content status scores and other weighted performance areas are then compared to the prior year's scores to determine the school's change level and assign an overall score and performance rating. All three Fulton County schools' scores reflected increases across grade and content areas. Fulton County Elementary School and Fulton County Middle School maintained their overall performance rating of orange. Fulton County High School increased one performance level, shifting FCHS to the highest performance level rating of blue! "Excellence keeps moving at Fulton County. We are proud of our students for reaching higher and achieving more," expressed Superintendent Patrice Chambers.
